AuSM's day and residential summer camps are designed for youth and adults with autism, ages 6+. AuSM is looking for camp counselors interested in getting direct support experience, learning and practicing strategies, and gaining awareness of the unique challenges that individuals with autism experience each day. If you are interested in a career in the healthcare field, in education, or in working with individuals on the spectrum (e.g. nursing, education, special ed., speech therapy, music therapy, occupational therapy, speech pathology, and more), this is a great opportunity for you!

Camp Hand in Hand Residential Camp

Provides 1:1 staff-to-camper ratio. Sessions are for youth and adults ages 9 and up with autism. Location: Camp Knutson, north of Brainerd, near Crosslake, Minnesota.

Camp Wahode Day Camp

1:2 staff-to-camper ratio. Sessions are for youth ages 6-12 with autism. Location: Camp Butwin, Eagan, MN. Note: Campers and counselors go home each evening and arrive back at camp each morning. Training provided in advance of camp.

Session 1: July 6-10, 2020 (Co-Ed Ages 6-12)

Session 2: July 20-24, 2020 (Co-Ed Ages 6-12)
