If an individual is able to participate safely in a program but requires more support than 1:4 staffing provides, the individual may bring a Direct Support Professional (DSP). A Developmental Perspective on Sexuality

Presenter: Logan Sand

Date: Oct. 17, 2023; 7-8:30 p.m.

The goal of this presentation is to provide information on healthy sexual development by discussing typical developmental milestones and what this means for parents, caregivers, and other caring adults. Participants also have the opportunity to practice responding to "teachable moments" to have discussions about healthy sexuality with the young people in their lives. This presentation will focus on healthy development for youth ages 0-18, but these teachable moment conversation skills can also be applied with adults that you care for or help support.



Logan Sand (they/them) has been the Program Manager for the Seeing and Exploring Life's Future (SELF) Program with Lutheran Social Service of MN since 2017. Their teaching philosophy is to provide anti-oppression and social justice-focused education with a particular focus on consent, decision making, and gender inclusion. Both Sand and the SELF Program are committed to comprehensive, medically accurate, and culturally appropriate sexuality education with a particular focus on individuals who face public health disparities. Sand has been a sexuality educator since 2014, and provides education to youth, parents/caregivers, and professionals in a variety of settings. Sand has presented at the National Sex Ed Conference, is published in the American Journal of Sexuality Education, and has sat on the Equity and Diversity Impact Assessment Committee for Minneapolis Public Schools and MDH's Suicide Prevention Taskforce.

Guardianship: What You Need to Know

Presenter: Jason Schellack

Date: Nov. 28, 2023; 7-8:30 p.m.

At age 18, a child is legally considered an adult. Some youth, however, aren't yet ready for all of the responsibilities of adulthood. Many children with ASD will continue to need assistance with their IEPs, transition services, making medical decisions, and applying for government benefits. To legally assist their adult children in these important areas, many parents and caregivers choose to establish legal guardianship.

Learn about the guardianship legal process, limited guardianship, and how some families can qualify for free legal assistance. Understand the powers and responsibilities guardians have under Minnesota law, and how successor guardians are chosen and appointed.

Jason Schellack (he/him) is the Managing Attorney at the Autism Advocacy & Law Center, LLC, a law firm dedicated to serving individuals with disabilities and their families. Schellack has worked with individuals with autism as a camp counselor, personal care attendant, public defender, and legal advocate. He practices primarily in the areas of guardianship, estate planning, family law, and special education law. Schellack is licensed to practice law in the State of Minnesota, as well as federal district court.

Minnesota Service Navigation

Join Jillian Nelson, AuSM's Community Resource and Public Policy Advocate, as she discusses the nuances of Minnesota service navigation. Jillian will also provide her own perspective of service navigation as an autistic adult. Learn what services are available and which ones may work best for you and your loved ones. Services vary on an individual and family basis; Jillian is not able to provide what an individual will qualify for in services. However, she can walk you through what the process is like and how to find out what someone qualifies for in the state of Minnesota.

Jillian Nelson (she/her), Community Resource and Policy Advocate for the Autism Society of Minnesota, was diagnosed with autism as a young adult. With a degree in human services and a background in self-advocacy, she has dedicated her career to helping others with autism achieve their goals, advocating for system change, and spreading a message of education and autism acceptance. Nelson currently sits on The Governor's Council for Developmental Disabilities. She also has worked in employment services, helping others with autism secure and retain appropriate, successful employment.



Online Dating: From Profile to Potential Relationship

Many unspoken rules come with dating and even more with online dating. Learn about some of those social rules as well as how to set up an online dating profile, discuss some of the popular dating apps, how to prepare for a date, and how to clarify and communicate what you want from online dating.

Alyssa Perau (she/they) is a sex education teacher for Lutheran Social Service's SELF program. She has been teaching the Sexuality for All Abilities curriculum for the last four years with AuSM, as well as teaching workshops about consent, boundaries, and online dating. Alyssa also loves teaching on topics like healthy relationships, privacy, and sexual orientation and gender identity. When she is not working, she is in graduate school to become an Expressive Arts Therapist and hanging out with her chihuahua Coconut.

Examining Our Roots: History of the Neurodiversity Movement

Presenter: Ira Eidle

Date: Jan. 23, 2024; 7-8:30 p.m.

The neurodiversity movement has existed for roughly thirty years. Much of that history is not well known by many people. There is a lot to discuss when it comes to the movement's history, and how it compares to other disability sub-movements as well as the greater disability rights movement. It is still a young movement, although lots of progress has been made since it started. This panel will go over the different eras thus far of the movement, highlight key moments, and discuss the strengths as well as the shortcomings of the neurodiversity movement.

Ira Eidle (he/him) is autistic and lives in Decatur, GA. He is the curator and webmaster of Autistic Archive, a website that aims to preserve and document the neurodiversity movement's history. Ira has participated in Autistic Self-Advocacy Network's Autism Campus Inclusion Leadership Academy and moderated a panel on Neurodiversity and Fandoms at DragonCon. He also works part-time at Georgia Aquarium as an exhibit interpreter. Ira holds a Bachelor's of the Arts Degree in Theatre and Performance Studies from Kennesaw State University.

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Multicultural Grant Projects

Backed by two Innovations Grants from the Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS), the Autism Society of Minnesota (AuSM) is supporting two nonprofit partners – the Somali Parents Autism Network (SPAN) and the Multicultural Autism Action Network (MAAN) – in helping families and individuals affected by autism overcome societal stigma and get culturally responsive services.

"Having seen the power of collaboration for more than 50 years in serving Minnesota's autism community, AuSM believes our partnerships with SPAN and MAAN are win-win opportunities for all of us – especially for the previously-underserved people in communities that we can now better support with our partners," said Ellie Wilson, AuSM's Executive Director.



SPAN and AuSM will collaborate to improve service delivery for Somali immigrant families in Minnesota with children, teens, and adults diagnosed with autism by connecting them to resources and services that are cognizant of their culture. "The Somali American Community Autism Partnership, aka Somali Autism Project, has the potential to transform the Somali community in Minnesota's perception about autism as a result of this project's public awareness campaign," said Mahdi Warsama, SPAN's Programs Director and Somali Autism Project Director.

Core initiatives for this DHS grant:

- Culturally competent consultation to Somali families regarding diagnosis, special education, and social services
- Education for service providers to increase understanding of Somali culture – and how best to support autistic people in the Somali community – while building caregiver capacity for broader inclusion and support
- Reducing autism-related stigma in the Somali community through a public awareness campaign by educating the public about developmental disabilities and neurodiversity



In the scope of this grant, MAAN and AuSM will focus on working with autistic adults to influence multicultural community perceptions around disability. This grant also seeks to improve access to service providers through outreach and education that bridges cultural barriers. "One of the greatest obstacles faced by families of children with disabilities is the stigma around disability which manifests differently in different cultural communities," said Maren Christenson, Executive Director of MAAN.

Project elements of this DHS grant include:

- Providing culturally appropriate support, empowerment, and training to families of children with disabilities through peer-to-peer networks
- Outreach to service providers on the unique challenges of providing services to individuals with disabilities and their families in multicultural communities
- Addressing societal views toward autism in multicultural communities

AuSM Advocacy



The 2023 legislative session was one of big wins for the AuSM Advocacy Committee. Here is a summary on disability rights wins:

TEFRA Parental Fee Elimination

The Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act (TEFRA) option for medical assistance allowed children with disabilities to qualify for medical assistance without considering the income and assets of parents. With this bill, parental fees no longer apply to those families.

Improving Medical Assistance for Employed Persons with Disabilities (MA-EPD)

The asset limit for MA-EPD has been removed, and there's a new requirement to notify people accessing MA of the existence of the MA-EPD program.

Phasing Out Subminimum Wage for People with Disabilities

The Task Force on Subminimum Wages – co-chaired by Jillian Nelson, AuSM’s Community Resource and Policy Advocate – made several funding recommendations for the Governor’s bill. Nearly all the Task Force’s recommendations passed – except for establishing an exact sunset date for subminimum wage in Minnesota.

PCA/CFSS (Community First Services and Supports) Rate Framework

This bill brings monumental wage and benefits increases for PCAs, as well an increase in provider reimbursement rates.

PCAs Allowed to Drive Clients

Before this bill, PCAs literally would have to go off the clock to drive their client anywhere. Now, PCAs can drive clients as a billable service.

40-hour Cap Lifted to 60-80

Parents of minors and spouses who are federally approved for the CDCS and CFSS programs can now get paid to work additional hours as caregivers. Previously, there was a 40-hour limit split between two parents – now it’s a combined 80 hours for two parents, or 60 hours for a single parent.



"This legislative session has brought hard-earned gains – it's both encouraging and heartwarming to see legislative consensus in favor of our community," said AuSM's Jillian Nelson. "But as policy advocates, we still have so much work to do at the Capitol for our diverse community."

Vaccine Clinics

The Kid Experts® at Children’s Minnesota, in partnership with AuSM and the Multicultural Autism Action Network (MAAN), are providing childhood and COVID-19 vaccines to children with autism or sensory issues. Specialists from AuSM and MAAN will provide support and sensory-friendly tools to ensure children have a comfortable vaccination experience.

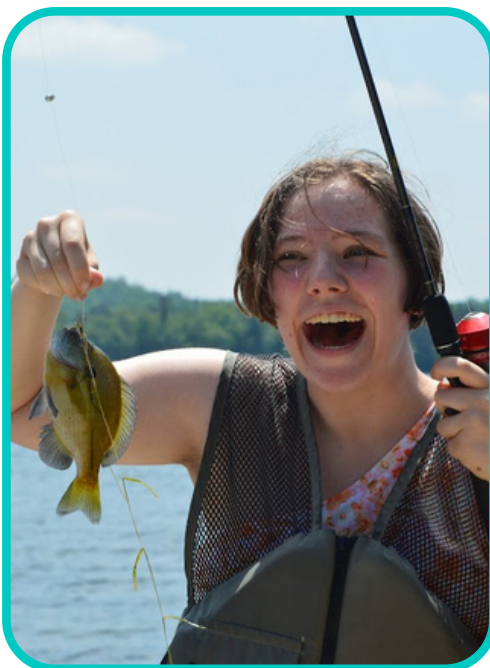

Therapy

AuSM therapists help individuals with autism from youth through adulthood as they grow at their own pace in a safe, compassionate, and respectful environment. AuSM's clinic is LGBTQIA-friendly and takes a neurodiversity-friendly approach to therapy, with many neurodivergent therapists on staff. We are a leader in adult and gender-affirming mental health services for autistics. Our therapists practice a variety of types of therapy, including EMDR, ACT, CBT, and hold licensures including LMFT, PhD, MA, MS, MSW, and more. About Our Study

The goal of this NIH-funded brain imaging study is to identify autism symptoms earlier in life.

Who Is Eligible?

Families with an infant 6 months old or younger with an older full sibling diagnosed with autism. Expectant parents are encouraged to contact us.

About Your Visit

Your infant and a parent will:

- Travel to Minneapolis when infant is 6-, 12-, and 24-months old for developmental testing and MRI scan during natural sleep
- Receive up to \$475 compensation and reimbursement for travel expenses at each in-person visit
- Complete remote visits with questionnaires and phone interview at 9- and 18-months old with \$50 in compensation
- Complete LENA language recordings at 6-, 12-, and 18-months old
